OBJECTIONS BY WILLIAM DICKERMAN TO SUBPOENA DUCES TECUM (for February

MICHAEL JACKSON,

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William Dickerman, who was previously an attorney for the complainants and certain family members, is the subject of a subpena duces tecum from defendat Michael Jackson, calling for a personal appearance in Dept. SM-2 of the above-entitled court, on February 8, 2005. Mr. Dickerman objects to the subpena on the following grounds:

1. The subpena is invalid because it was not personally served on Mr. Dickerman, in violation of Cal. Code of Civil

Procedure §1987, which requires that a subpena be served "by delivering a copy...to the witness personally." As the attached declaration shows, service was not effected since the subpena was not served personally but rather placed by an anonymous person in Mr. Dickerman's mailbox.

2. To the extent the subpena calls for documents that concern the "COMPLAINT," it is unintelligible since Mr. Dickerman has never seen the "COMPLAINT" in this case. See attached declaration.

3. The subpena calls for numerous documents privileged from discovery by the attorney-client and work product doctrines. Mr. Dickerman represented the "COMPLAINANTS" for a considerable period of time, and all of their correspondence, notes of meetings and conversations, phone records, and other documents concerning that representation are privileged. Notes of meetings and conversations with other individuals contacted by Mr. Dickerman in the course of his representation, for the benefit of the "COMPLAINANTS," are similarly privileged. Such individuals include but are not limited to other counsel consulted about the representation.

4. The subpena is intolerably overbroad. For instance, item 5(e) calls for all documents having anything whatever to do with this case, either "directly or indirectly." It is impossible to know what "directly or indirectly" means. It is also oppressive and burdensome to require production of every document in Mr.

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Dickerman's possession, custody, or control having to do with the Michael Jackson case, whether or not generated by Mr. Dickerman. It is defendant's burden, not a third party witness's responsibility, to obtain documents about the case, other than those that Mr. Dickerman would have special reason to have. For example, if Mr. Dickerman maintained a scrapbook of press clippings about the case for his own interest, it would be preposterous to expect him to supply those materials to defendant, so that defendant would not have to do his own research. 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I, WILLIAM DICKERMAN, declare as follows:

1. I am an active member of the California State Bar. I know the following facts of my own personal knowledge, and if called as a witness I could and would competently testify thereto under oath.

2. I served as an attorney for the alleged molestation victim of defendant Michael Jackson, as well as the victim's mother and certain other family members, from about February 2003 until about October 2003.

3. On January 27, 2005, I found in my mailbox, across from my office, 22 pages and two envelopes. The pages included a subpoena duces tecum, calling for me to deliver documents to the court on February 8, 2005; an application for the subpoena, a protective order dated July 9, 2004; a letter to me from Brian Oxman; a declaration of custodian of records for me to complete; and a copy of those documents.

2. I have never been personally served with any of these documents, nor have I ever authorized anyone to accept them on my behalf.

3. This is the second time that defendant Jackson has failed

to serve a subpoena on me. The first one was with regard to a court hearing last summer at which my attendance was required. Although service was improper, as noted in the motion to quash filed on behalf of me and the complainant mother, I did appear at the hearing.

4. The current subpoena is invalid because in that it violates CCP §1987, which defines "service" of a subpoena as "delivering a copy...to the witness personally...." As noted, the subpoena and all other documents were placed in my mailbox (apparently by the mailroom personnel), not given to me personally.

5. I have never seen a "complaint" in the current case, nor am I aware of what is alleged, except generally as stated in various cursory media accounts.

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
