and two counts of brandishing a firearm during and in relation to a crime of violence, for robbing the Citibank at 3990 South Maryland Parkway on May 18, 2004, and the Bank of Commerce at 5295 Decatur Avenue on January 31, 2005. Mr. Carter is charged with robbing both banks by force, violence and intimidation using a Smith and Wesson 9 millimeter semi-automatic pistol.

2. Mr. Carter has recently been indicted in Nevada state court on 15 felony counts, including first-degree kidnapping, burglary, robbery, coercion and possession of a firearm by an ex-felon.

The charges in both cases are still pending. Although Mr. Sneddon has made no offers to assist Mr. Carter with regard to those prosecutions, Mr. Carter or his lawyers may attempt to gain benefit in those cases by claiming cooperation with the government in this unrelated case against Mr. Jackson.

However, since Mr. Carter has asserted his Fifth Amendment rights and is refusing to answer any question directly or indirectly related to these charges, this Court has ordered both parties in this case to refrain from any questioning in these areas. Nevertheless, you may draw a negative inference from Mr. Carter's claim of privilege with regard to the believability of Mr. Carter's testimony." (See *People v. Hecker* (1990) 219 Cal.App. 1238.)
