DECORUM ORDER REGARDING SANTA MARIA COURT COMPLEX

In the interest of justice, for the safety of individuals attending the proceedings of the aforementioned case, and to preserve the dignity of the court and the integrity of the proceedings the Court orders that:

- 1. All members of the media shall display official court and media credentials at all times.
- All persons are subject to weapons- and recording- or imaging-device screening.
 Court-approved security and court personnel may be exempted from this rule.
- Interviews and/or press conferences shall be conducted in designated areas only.
- 4. Video and still cameras shall be permitted in established pool positions only. Those areas are:
 - A stationary position on the north side of the walkway on the east side of Building G between the curb and Building G. This position may be used for getting shots of individuals entering and leaving the Building G.

- A stationary position outside the entrance of Building G between Buildings G &
 C. This position may be used to get shots of individuals leaving Building G and for statements of parties as they exit Building G. This position shall include pool audio.
- On the pedestrian bridge overlooking the walkway on the east side of the Building G.
- In the hallway inside Building G between the building entrance and Department
 9, as directed by the Court. No audio recording shall be permitted at the hallway pool position.
- 5. Pool positions are to be staffed by court-approved media agencies only.
- 6. All wires and cables shall be secured or covered. All wiring and cabling shall be arranged in a manner that does not prohibit the movement of pedestrian traffic, court personnel with file carts and individuals in wheelchairs from moving about the court campus.
- Pool positions may be rescinded, restricted or otherwise modified as ordered by the court.
- 8. Reporters, photographers, videographers and audio technicians are permitted only in designated media areas for this case.
- All persons shall comply with city- and county-established parking requirements and restrictions.
- Parking shall be permitted in designated areas only. No parking shall be permitted in posted reserved spaces.
- 11. Media satellite trucks, microwave vans and other equipment vehicles shall park only in those areas designated by the county. No non-transmission vehicle media parking is permitted on the court campus.
- 12. Members of the media may park their private vehicles on levels two and three of the Town Center Mall parking structure, located on the north side of Cook Street.

13. During peak periods of interest, for the safety of those attending court proceedings, access to the court campus may be restricted to persons with official court business only, or those attending a scheduled court hearing. Proof of business with the court may be required by law enforcement.

Violation of this order may result in the violator being held in contempt of court and/or being subject to monetary sanction pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure 177.5.

It is so ordered.
