- 4. The existence of a felony conviction of any material witness whose credibility is likely to be critical to the outcome of the trial;
  - 5. Any exculpatory evidence;
- 6. Relevant written or recorded statements of witnesses or reports of the statements of witnesses whom the prosecutor intends to call at the trial, including any reports or statements of experts made in conjunction with the case, including the results of physical or mental examinations, scientific tests, experiments, or comparisons which the prosecutor intends to offer in evidence at the trial;
- 7. All crime reports prepared in relation to the investigation and prosecution of this case including Extortion. Child Abduction and False Imprisonment crime reports;
- 8. In the event the alleged crimes occurred in other jurisdictions, please identify the jurisdiction and the personnel from that jurisdiction;





All information, in any form, of any inducements, promises, representations of assurances, whether or not reduced to writing, given to any informant(s) involved in this matter, related to this matter, including, but not limited to plea agreements, dismissals of charges, and agreements not to prosecute, related to either the informant or any third party beneficiary;
