On January 23, 2004 the court issued a protective order in this case prohibiting attorneys for either side from, among other things: "3. Mak[ing] any statement for public dissemination as to the existence or possible existence of any document, exhibit, photograph or any other evidence, the admissibility of which may have to be determined by the Court"; "4. Express[ing] outside of court an opinion or mak[ing] any comment for public dissemination as to the weight, value, or effect of any evidence as tending to establish guilt or innocence"; and "7. Mak[ing] any out-of court statement as to the nature, source, or effect of any purported evidence alleged to have been accumulated as a result of the investigation of this matter."

On December 4, 2004 the People obtained a DNA sample from defendant pursuant to a court ordered search warrant. That very same day, the New York Post published a story quoting Brian Oxman, one of defendant's attorneys, revealing previously confidential evidence; commenting upon the purpose of the search warrant and offering exculpatory opinions regarding the evidence. (See Exhibit "A.") The People now ask the Court for an order to show cause why Brian Oxman should not be held in contempt.

ATTORNEY BRIAN OXMAN IS IN DIRECT VIOLATION OF THE COURT'S PROTECTIVE ORDER

On December 4, 2004, the New York Post published an article concerning the DNA search of Michael Jackson in which attorney for defendant, Brian Oxman is quoted as saying that: "the deputies were looking for DNA evidence that would link Jackson to the young cancer patient he is accused of sexually abusing" The article continued, "Oxman said investigators had found traces of DNA evidence from three males other than Jackson in the star's Neverland bedroom – but none from his accuser. Asked to explain the DNA that was found, Oxman said: "Kids crash where they crash. They play in his room, and that's where they crashed."

It appears from the foregoing that Attorney Oxman has disseminated evidence in this case and provided exculpatory commentary thereon to the national press. He should be ordered to explain why he should not be held in contempt for this seemingly deliberate violation of the Court's protective order.

A proposed Order to Show Cause for Brian Oxman with a proposed hearing date on one of the dates currently scheduled for the next appearances in this matter is attached.

December 4, 2004 – Santa Barbara sheriff's deputies armed with a search warrant yesterday raided Michael Jackson's Neverland Ranch apparently in search of DNA

evidence they believe will lock up their child-molestation case against the disgraced King of Pop.

The raid came just over a year after more than 60 investigators descended on the pop star's storybook spread and hauled off truckloads of his personal effects.

Jackson lawyer Brian Oxman said he believed the deputies yesterday were looking for DNA evidence that would link Jackson to the young cancer patient he is accused of sexually abusing during overnight visits in February and March 2003.

The moon-walking megastar is charged with seven counts of committing lewd acts on the boy, who was 12 at the time, and two counts of using alcohol to seduce him.

Oxman said investigators had found traces of DNA from three males other than Jackson in the star's Neverland bedroom — but none from his accuser.

Asked to explain the DNA that was found, Oxman said: "Kids crash where they crash. They play in his room, and that's where they crash."

Santa Barbara officials confirmed they had searched Jackson's estate, but would not reveal what they were seeking — or what they had seized.

A caravan of unmarked Santa Barbara County sheriff's department vans — with lead investigator Lt. Jeff Klapakis at the head of the procession — departed Neverland after the eight-hour search.

Sources close to the boy's family said the deputies were acting on information provided by videographer Marc Schaffel, an unindicted co-conspirator in the molestation case.

They said Schaffel is now cooperating with authorities.

Schaffel, a gay-porn filmmaker, last month against Jackson seeking \$3 million in unpaproducing fees.
