2	The procedure for scaling records under California Rules of Court, rule 243.1 et se		
3	applies only to records that are deemed public. (Id., rule 243.1(a)(2).) Motions and responsive		
4	pleadings in criminal cases are, ordinarily, "public" records of the court.		
5	Rule 243.1(d) provides that		
6	The court may order that a record be filed under seal only if it expressly finds facts that establish:		
8	(1) There exists an overriding interest that overcomes the right of public access to the record;		
9 10	(2) The overriding interest supports scaling the record;		
11	(3.) A substantial probability exists that the overriding interest will be prejudiced if the record is not sealed;		
13	(4) The proposed sealing is narrowly tailored; and		
14	(5) No less restrictive means exist to achieve the overriding interest.		
15	Rule 243.1(c) provides, in portinent part:		
16	(1) An order scaling the record must (i) specifically set forth the		
17	facts findings that support the findings and (ii) direct the scaling of only those documents and pages, or, if reasonably practicable, portions of those documents and pages, that contain the material that needs to be placed under scal. All other portions of each documents
