9 defense to view the exhibits. The Sheriff is to notify defense counsel before forensic
10 examination of a given exhibit commences if that examination will consume so much of the
11 exhibit that further examination by the defense will not be possible, to allow the defense to
12 apply to the court for such additional order as may be appropriate in the premises. Examination
13 involving the use of Ninhydrin on an exhibit is excluded from the foregoing.

14 The defense may make separate application to the Court for an order allowing it to
15 conduct its own forensic examination of given Grand Jury exhibits, which application will be
16 considered on its own merits when and if it is made.

17 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Sheriff lodge a photograph of each of the
18 below-listed Exhibits with the Court at the time of its release to the Sheriff's representative,
19 pursuant to Penal Code section 1417.2.

20 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Sheriff return all exhibits to the custody of the
21 Court upon completion of necessary forensic examination.


