IT IS ORDERED that RAY CRISP, the Officer in Charge of the Los Angeles Police


1 Department's Discovery Section, 201 N. Los Angeles Street, Suite 301, Los Angeles 90012,

3 taken by employees of the Los Angeles Police Department at Neverland Valley Ranch in Los
4 Olivos, California on or about August 21, 1993, together with any videotapes taken on the
5 same occasion, if any, and a copy of any report concerning the taking of the photographs and
6 videotaping (if videotaping was done) to the Santa Barbara District Attorney's Office on
7 September 13, 2004, at a time agreed upon by the parties and allow the parties to inspect the
8 photographs, videotapes and report and copy such of them as either party may request .

9 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Santa Barbara District Attorney's Office and
10 defense counsel maintain the confidentiality of the photographs, videotapes and reports
11 obtained pursuant to this Order.

12 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Santa Barbara District Attorney's Office retain
13 in its custody such of the original photographs obtained from the Officer in Charge of the Los
14 Angeles Police Department's Discovery Section as are selected by either or both parties until
15 further order of this Court, unless both parties agree that a copy thereof may be retained and
16 used as may be relevant.
